

Biblical Allusion—Presentation Assignment

Major Graded Assignment

Directions: in your small group you will be given 5-6 biblical allusions to research and present to the class. You will need to use a software program such as PowerPoint, Photo Story, or Movie Maker to present your information. We will have several days in the computer lab for you and your group to build your presentation. Each member of your group must have a specific role on which members will receive individual grades. In the event that a group member is absent on the day of the presentation, the rest of the group must present the absent member's material to the class.

If you are absent on the day of the presentation---you will receive an alternative assignment, which will demonstrate your understanding of the biblical allusions and their role in literature. This assignment will be in the form of a five page (typed, double spaced, 12 font, Arial) report and include a works cited page (MLA format throughout).

Your presentation must include the following information: (for continuity I am using the terms for PowerPoint presentations).

1. A title slide that includes the names and roles of all group members. Example
 - a. John Smith—editor/technician **
 - b. Jane Doe—researcher/presenter for allusion #1, 4
 - c. Bill Williams—researcher/presenter for allusion #2, 5
 - d. Mary Matthews—researcher/presenter for allusion #3, 6
2. Each allusion must have slides that explain the biblical story or character.
3. Each allusion must have slides that explain how the story or character is used in literature.
4. Each group member must present his or her allusions to the class. In the case of an absent member the editor/technician will present the absent member's allusions.

If you would like to discuss your presentations with me, there will be time in class or you (as a group or individually) may come to tutorials before or after school, or during advisory.

**While this member is not responsible for researching or presenting material, this member must be prepared to present and must therefore be knowledgeable of all the allusions. This member will be graded on the way the slides are presented, the order, the spelling, and the background and transitions.
